







5: Certificate of Completion

• Sample to be provided by the teacher.

6: Action Plan

• Sample to be provided by the teacher.

7: Materials Used

• List down all the materials used by you in making the project.

8: Report

• Report to be written in approx.1000 words.

9: Student Reflections

• Share your views/conclusion on the given topic and write the learning outcomes.

10: Evidence of your report

• Photographs and other pieces of evidence of the research to be pasted.

11: Bibliography

• Pen down the sources from where the information was accessed.

- ➤ Short-term and long-term implications of economic strategies suggested during research.
- ➤ Validity, reliability, appropriateness, and relevance of data used for research work and for presentation in the project file.
- Presentation and writing that is succinct and coherent in the project file.
- > Citation of the materials referred to in the file in footnotes, resources section, bibliography etc.

I. Project One: Field Visit

1. Visit a Departmental Store.

OR

- 2. Visit a Mall.
- 1. <u>Visit a Departmental Store</u>- You are required to observe the following:
 - a) Different departments and their layout.
 - b) Nature of products offered for sale.
 - c) Display of fresh arrivals.
 - d) Promotional campaigns.
 - e) Spaces and advertisements.
 - f) Assistance by Sales Personnel.
 - g) Billing counter at the store Cash, Credit Card/ Debit Card, swipe facility. Added attractions and facilities at the counter.
 - h) Additional facilities offered to customers.
 - i) Any other relevant aspect.

- 2. <u>Visit a Mall- You are required to observe the following:</u>
 - a) Number of floors, shops occupied and unoccupied.
 - b) Nature of shops, their ownership status
 - c) Nature of goods dealt in: local brands, international brands,
 - d) Service business shops- spas, gyms, saloons, etc.
 - e) Rented spaces, owned spaces,
 - f) Different types of promotional schemes.
 - g) Most visited shops.
 - h) Special attractions of the Mall-Food court, Gaming zone, Cinema, etc.
- i) Innovative facilities.
- j) Parking facilities.

II - Project Two: Case Study on a Product

- 1. Take a product having seasonal growth and regular demand. For example,
 - > Apples from Himachal Pradesh or Kashmir

OR

> Oranges from Nagpur

Develop a Case Study on the following lines:

- (i) Research for change in the price of the product. For example, apples in Himachal Pradesh duringplucking and non plucking seasons.
- (ii) Effect on prices in the absence of an effective transport system.
- (iii) Effect on prices in the absence of suitable warehouse facilities.
- (iv) Duties performed by the warehouses.
- (v) Demand and supply situation of the product during harvesting season, prices near the place of origin andaway.

The research can include the importance of producing and selling these products and their processed items along with the roles of Transport, Warehousing, Advertising, Banking, Insurance, Packaging, Wholesale selling, Retailing, Cooperative farming, Cooperative marketing, etc.

III - Project Three: Aids to Trade

Taking any one AID TO TRADE, for Example Insurance, and gathering information on the following aspects:

- 1) History of Insurance Lloyd's contribution.
- 2) Development of regulatory mechanism.
- 3) Insurance Companies in India
- 4) Principles of Insurance.
- 5) Types of Insurance.
- 6) Importance of Insurance to businessmen.
- 7) Benefits of crop, orchards, animal, and poultry insurance to the farmers.
- 8) Terminologies used (premium, face value, market value, maturity value, surrender value) and theirmeanings.

IV- Project Four: Import/Export Procedure

You need to identify a product of your city/country that is imported /exported. You are required to find the details of the actual import/export procedure. You may take help from the Chambers of Commerce, bankers, existing Importers/Exporters, etc. You should find details of the procedure. The specimens of documents collected should be pasted in the Project file with a brief description of each. You may also visit railway godowns /dockyards / transport agencies and may collect pictures of the same.

The following essentials are required to be fulfilled for its preparation and submission.

- 1. The total project will be in a file format.
- 2. The project will be handwritten.
- 3. The project will be presented in a neat folder.
- 4. The project report will be developed in the following sequence-
 - ♦ The cover page should have the title of the project, student information, school, and year.
 - ♦ List of contents.
 - ♦ Acknowledgments and preface (acknowledging the institution, the newspapers read, T.V. channels viewed, places visited and persons who have helped).
 - ♦ Introduction.
 - → Topic with a suitable heading.
 - ♦ Planning and activities done during the project, if any.
 - ♦ Observations and findings while conducting the project.
 - ♦ Newspaper clippings.
 - ♦ Conclusions (summarized suggestions or findings, the future scope of the study).
 - ♦ Appendix (if needed).

ACCOUNTANCY

Students can choose any one topic for their project work from the following:

- 1. Collection of source documents, preparation of vouchers, and recording of transactions with the help of vouchers.
- 2. Preparation of Bank Reconciliation Statement with the given cash book and the pass book with twenty to twenty-five transactions.
- 3. Comprehensive project of any sole proprietorship business. This may state with journal entries and their lingering, preparation of Trial balance. Trading and Profit and Loss Account and Balance Sheet. Expenses, incomes, profit (loss), assets, and liabilities are to be depicted using a pie chart/bar diagram. This may include simple GST-related transactions.
