ACTIVITY-1 VOWEL SORTING

MATERIAL REQUIRED:

- Old empty box (any shape)-1
- Printed or coloured sheet (to cover the box)
- Flower cut-outs
- Few equal sizes circles
- Fevicol
- Scissors (under parental supervision)



INSTRUCTIONS:

- Take any empty old box and cover with coloured or printed sheet.
- Now cut a flower with a coloured sheet and write a vowel on it and paste it in the box as shown in the picture.

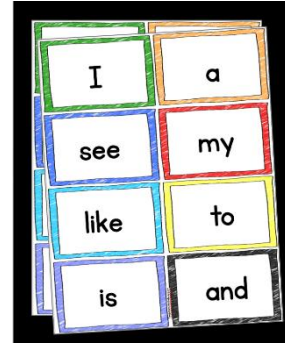
ACTIVITY-2

ACTIVITY 1 NUMBER GAME

MATERIAL REQUIRED-

- Pastel sheets of different colours-3

INSTRUCTIONS-

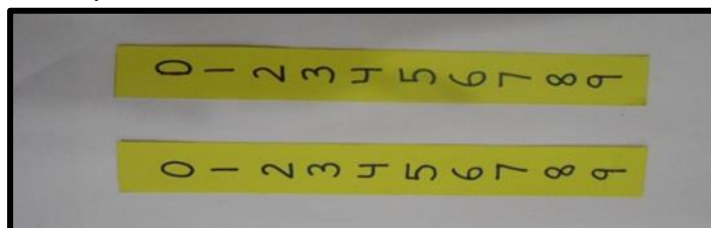
- For the base, a square piece of pastel sheet of any colour to be taken. (Size: 8"X8")



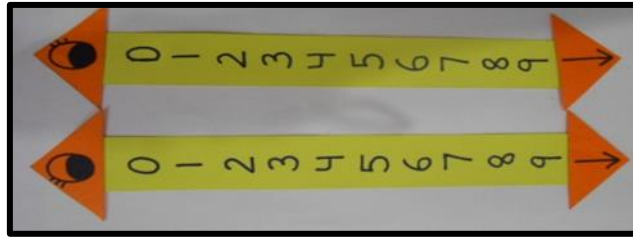
- Now choose any other colour pastel sheet and cut 2 rectangular strips for the number line. (Size:11"X1.5")



- On both the strips write numbers from 0 to 9.

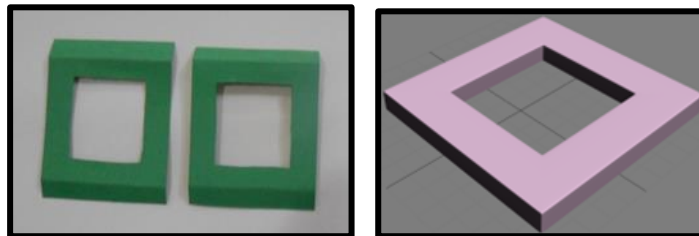


- Cut 4 triangles and paste on the top and bottom edges of both the rectangular strips.

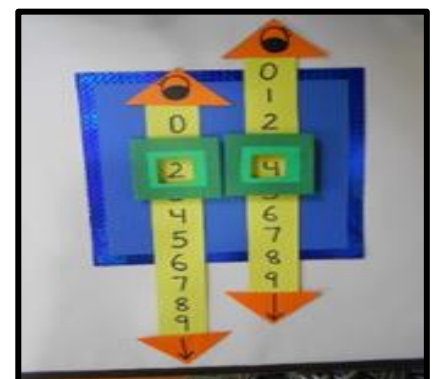
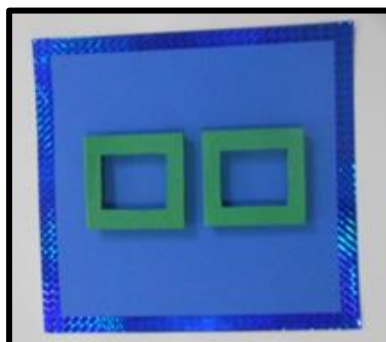
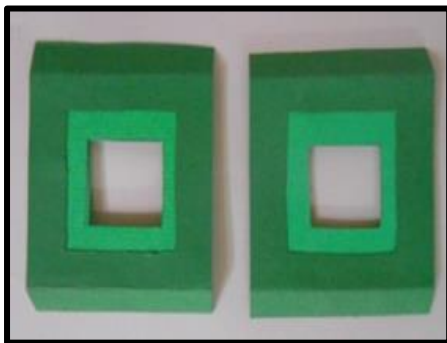


- We will use the third pastel sheet to make 2 windows.
- For window 2 square pieces of size (1") need to be cut.

Leaving half an inch from all the four sides of the square piece, we will cut out a smaller square piece to make a window.



- Fold the base paper to divide it into 2 equal halves. Now paste the first window at the center of the first half and the second window at the center of the second half, (as shown in the fig.)



ACTIVITY 2

FINGER FUN ADDITION

LEARNING OBJECTIVE- Using fingers for addition can help children in developing mental Math strategies, which are important for quick and efficient problem-solving.

MATERIAL REQUIRED:

- Chart paper {any colour}-1
- A-4 size pastel sheet {any colour}-2
- Number cut outs {from 1 to 9}
- Pencil and Scissors
- Fevicol



METHODOLOGY-

1. Trace both your hands on an A4 sheet.
2. Cut both the tracing.
3. Now paste them on an A-4 size sheet (not the fingers).
4. Make the sign of addition and number cut outs in square shape from the second pastel sheet.
5. It is now ready to be used.

ACTIVITY-1
FROM TRASH TO TREASURE

MATERIAL REQUIRED-

- A4 size coloured sheet-1 (Blue or any other colour)
- Googly eyes-2 (large size)
- White String/Wool - a small ball
- Oil Pastel - Pink colour
- Black Marker - 1
- Button -1 (pink, grey, black)
- Glue -1



INSTRUCTIONS-

- Cut the face, body and ears of the bunny from a newspaper.
- Draw two ovals for the ears and colour it pink to give the effect of the ears.
- Paste the face, body and ears on an A4 sized sheet.
- Paste the googly eyes on the face, button for the nose and thread or wool to make the whiskers of the bunny.
- Use a black marker to make the mouth (as shown in the picture).
You can be as creative as you want to be.

NOTE- HELP YOUR WARD TO LEARN

- Recognize and identify animals.
- Know the mother, father, and baby names of animals.
- Know the sounds made by animals.
- Know what kinds of products we get from animals.



ACTIVITY-2

A BUTTERFLY PUPPET WITH LIFT THE FLAPS

LEARNING OBJECTIVE- Students will be able to identify the stages in the life cycle of a butterfly. Students will be able to create a butterfly model, arranging the stages it's life cycle in the correct order.

MATERIAL REQUIRED-

- white sheet A4 (2 sheets)
- kulfi stick
- colours
- Fevicol



INSTRUCTIONS-

- Cut out a butterfly shape.
- Colour it, then attach it to sticks.
- Cut folded circles of paper.
- Draw the stages of the life cycle on the bottom layer of each circle.
- Glue them onto the butterfly, and decorate the top layer to fit in with the butterfly's markings.

NOTE- The student will speak and explain about the different stages of the life cycle of a butterfly in the class in July. This prop has to be used.

ACTIVITY-3

WEATHER WHEEL ACTIVITY

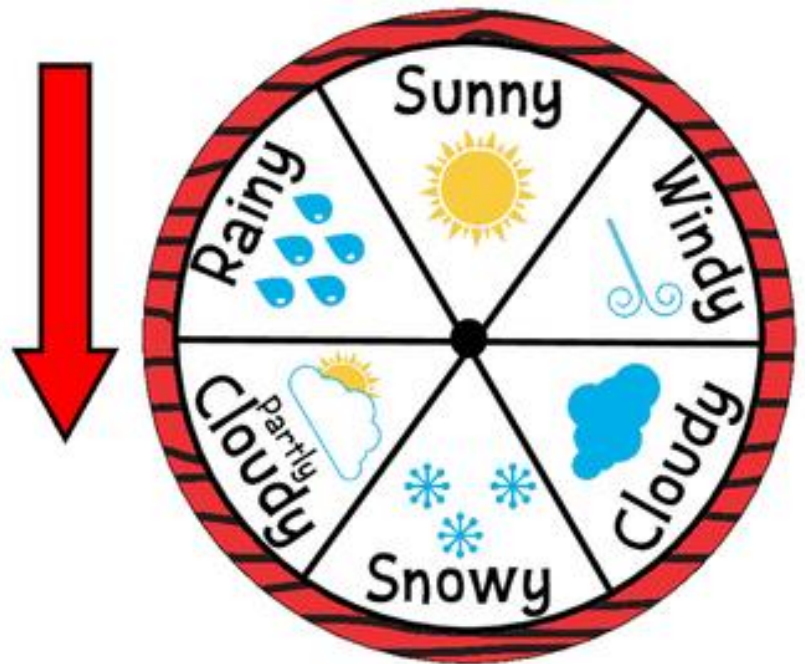
LEARNING OBJECTIVE- Children record changes in the weather and recognize the patterns within the weather. These alone are valid goals, but it's also helpful for students to understand more fully why weather is important to them.

MATERIAL REQUIRED-

- Cardboard
- Fevicol

INSTRUCTIONS-

- Glue onto a piece of cardboard.
- Cut out the wheel and the arrow.
- Punch a hole in the arrow.
- Punch a hole in the middle of the weather wheel.
- Fasten the arrow and the weather wheel together with a split pin.



NOTE- In the Weather worksheet, students will monitor and record the daily weather for one week. When the chart is complete, the parent can ask some questions such as- How many days were sunny? etc.
