Our students made rakhis for soldiers stationed at the borders. These handmade tokens are not just symbols of a festival but heartfelt expressions of gratitude and support for the brave men who protect our country.

The value of the month was **KINDNESS** and students began their lesson on kindness by watching a video that illustrated the meaning and importance of being kind to others. This visual introduction helped them grasp the concept through real-life examples and stories. Following the video, they read a book about kindness, which further reinforced the ideas they had seen and introduced new perspectives on how to be kind in various situations. To put their learning into practice, the students engaged in an activity called "A Kind Kid and My Pot of Kindness," where they identified acts of kindness they could perform and shared these ideas with their classmates. This hands-on activity allowed them to creatively express and commit to spreading kindness in their daily lives.

Children also did a lot of hands-on activities in different subjects to understand various concepts which were introduced to them. In **English** related to the Chapter Nouns, students did a lot of activities like solving puzzles, rolling a noun dice and visiting noun towns. By learning nouns in a fun and engaging way, our students developed a deeper understanding and appreciation for language.

In **E.V.S**, in our recent activities related to the chapter Work Around Us, we began with an introductory activity called Who Am I? in which students dressed up as various occupations around them and spoke a few lines about it. This engaging start helped students connect with the topic on a personal level. As we progressed through the chapter, we focused on the critical issue of child labor. To enhance understanding, we showed a video explaining what child labor is and the harsh realities faced by children subjected to it. Additionally, we conducted a role play on child labor to vividly portray the difficulties these children endure and emphasize the importance of eradicating this practice. In our recent exploration of the chapter Plants Around Us, we began with an engaging video that showcased various types of trees and illustrated how different plants thrive in diverse climates. This visual introduction set the stage for a deeper understanding of plant life. Following the video, we took the students on a nature walk around the school grounds. During this walk, they observed the different types of plants growing in our environment. Upon returning to the classroom, the students expressed their observations through drawings, capturing the variety of plants they had encountered during the nature walk. This hands-on activity helped reinforce their learning and allowed them to connect with the natural world in a meaningful way.

While studying multiplication in **Mathematics**, students participated in an array activity to visualize and understand the concept. The hands-on exercise helped them see how numbers can be grouped and multiplied in a structured manner. Additionally, in the Math lab, they engaged in a multiplication puzzle where they demonstrated multiplication problems using a multiplication board and rubber bands.

In **Hindi** they did an activity in which students engaged in a spirited game of word antakshari, where they not only enjoyed the word challenge but also expanded their vocabulary. Each participant had to quickly think of a word whose title started with the last letter of the previous word title, prompting them to recall and discover new words. This activity not only fostered a fun-filled atmosphere but also enhanced their linguistic skills as they learned unfamiliar words and explored diverse words.
