- Name the Vegetable Activity (Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav) --- Students pasted pictures of any two vegetables on an A4 size sheet. Then they named the vegetables in another Indian language and shared them in class.
- Intra Class Panchatantra Character Show and Tell Competition ---- Students dressed up as their favourite character from any Panchatantra story and spoke few lines about it. This competition was organised to celebrate Book Week with the aim of developing their interest and likings towards books. Students participated enthusiastically and won everyone's heart with their excellent performance.

Value of the month was **KINDNESS** towards human beings and animals. Students watched videos on kindness and engaged in discussions about being kind towards everyone. Extending the activity, they created a collage and felt great in sharing their thoughts in class.

The academic front made learning interesting through various hands-on activities in all the subjects to understand various concepts. In **Math** an online activity was done on **Multiplication** where students rolled the dice and solved the multiplication sums mentally. In **Division**, an activity named Division Card Relay, was conducted which combined learning with interactive play. Each child received a play card with a division sum and its answer. The game began with one child calling out the division sum aloud (e.g., "I am 36 divided by 6. Who has the answer?"). The respective child with the correct answer card (e.g., "I have 6") then told the answer and read his / her own division sum continuing the relay. This process repeated until all cards were used, making sure each child participated. This engaging activity not only reinforced division skills but also fostered teamwork and active listening.

In EVS students were engaged in a fun and interactive learning experience! In Chapter 5 – Fun We Have, students worked in groups, explored various models of different indoor games created by them and explained to each other how to play the games. In addition to this, in Chapter 6 – Work Around Us, students dressed up like their favourite Community Helper and then spoke lines about their dream profession. They also learnt about skilled and unskilled work and understood this concept more by segregating these two types of work with the help of picture cut-outs of various occupations.

In **Hindi**, the students made pictures of the famous freedom fighters who took part in India's freedom struggle and wrote the slogans for the countrymen, which worked for public consciousness and also fills us with enthusiasm even today. Through this activity, they learned about the freedom struggle of our country.

Rakhi Making Activity was done by the Art teacher where the students made beautiful and colourful rakhis for the soldiers.
