Greetings and welcome back!

Vacation is the period during which students relax, spend quality time with their friends and family, and hone their co-curricular and extra-curricular skills. The students were once again excited to come to school.

The month of July began with excitement where the students were engaged in different activities to keep them occupied. They also shared how they spent their summer break. The month began with welcoming the students with a beautiful Welcome back craft.

On the academic front, students were introduced to cursive writing of letters b,h,k,l,t,j,i,p with stories,clay moulding and Sight words –an, by, do, go, if, me, my, no,or, up.and to the concept of tens and ones(1-70) with recapitulation of concept- missing numbers, after,before and between through various activities.

In the theme ‘**Plants**’ children learnt about the process of germination,parts of plants and their function,types of plants, What we can get from the plants and the process of Photosynthesis. Introducing the different parts of plants through a fun rhyme that helps children remember and understand the functions of roots, stems, leaves, and flowers. Various Hands-on activities were done, where children explore different types of seeds, compare their sizes, shapes, and textures.Children went on nature walks to observe and identify different plants in their environment as well as teacher encouraged them to notice similarities and differences between plants and discuss their observations. Children were engaged in simple gardening tasks such as planting, watering, and caring for plants.Sorting and categorizing plants based on their colours, shapes, or types (e.g., flowers, trees, vegetables).Creating plant-themed artwork using materials like vegetables cutouts,sun,clouds etc.Each of these topics provides a comprehensive understanding of plants and their role in the environment. It’s a great way for children to connect science with the natural world around them!

Children celebrated the Book week with multiple storytelling sessions taken by Storyteller Neeta Joshi (Learner’s Hub) and through class teachers through props.We at Imperial Heritage school celebrated Book week from 15th July – 19nd July. The event witnessed many activities. Students of UKG were engaged in making bookmarks (Giraffe), Dr. Seuss Craft and D.E.A.R (Drop Everything and Read Day) where all students and teachers were given a storybook for picture reading. When the instruction was given, everyone had to stop what they were doing and read their book.Panchatantra story narration was done by the teacher’s with a moral.During the festive season of Raksha Bandhan, students had a great time creating a personalized rakhi for the Soldiers.

World paper bag day was celebrated where Role Play was done (Grocery Shopping with Paper Bag)by the kids of Pre Primary. Students learn about the harmful impacts of plastic on our environment and provide eco-friendly alternatives.

The world is full of colours and each colour has a significance. Colour Blue Day was celebrated in school where students engaged in discussions and identified blue items around themselves. They also spoke about blue objects they got from home, most of them carrying something precious to them. They were keen to showcase the same to their teachers and friends. 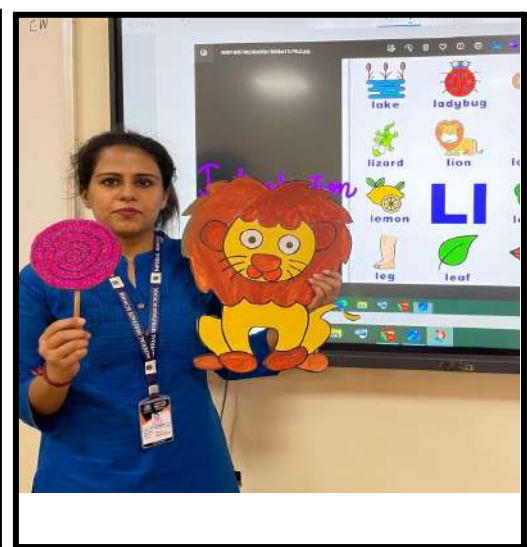

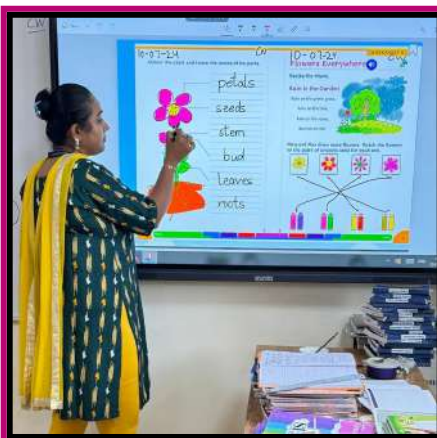
