December holds a special place for many around the world, marking the close of one chapter and the dawn of new beginnings. It is a time of reflection, celebration, and anticipation for what lies ahead. For us, December also brings an opportunity to demonstrate our dedication to the school as we prepare for our Annual event. Let's welcome this vibrant month with boundless passion and enthusiasm!

The month of November was filled with celebrations of festivals, activities, and learning of certain new concepts and focused on the holistic development of students. In the previous month, students made a beautiful toran, celebrating the spirit of Diwali. Students also participated in an Intra Class Ramayan Competition, where they dressed up as characters from the Ramayan, celebrating the spirit of Diwali.

Children's Day is a reminder for everyone to celebrate the innocence, joy, and potential of every child. It's a day dedicated to making children feel special and appreciated. In schools, this day is often filled with fun activities, games, and celebrations to make students feel happy and loved. In our Grade I classroom, we had an exciting Children's Day celebration filled with laughter and joy as the school organised a fun filled bagless day, full of exciting rides, movie time and a magical magic show.

Transport Day is a wonderful way to introduce young students to the different modes of transportation and how they help us in our daily lives. Students celebrated the day with a fun and educational Show and Tell activity. They were excited to learn about various vehicles and share their knowledge with their classmates. A week before Transport Day, students were given a task to bring a toy vehicle, a picture, or a drawing of their favorite mode of transport. They were also encouraged to learn a few lines about their chosen vehicle to present to the class.

Honesty was the value for the month. "I promise to always tell the truth, I promise to be kind and honest every day, I promise to admit my mistakes and learn from them." These lines were used for discussions, role-plays, and a classroom activity where students learnt and shared their thoughts on honesty.

To make learning prepositions both fun and educational, Grade I students conducted a Paper Cut-Out Truck activity. This creative and hands-on lesson allowed students to explore prepositions by writing them on colourful paper cut-outs of trucks. The activity not only helped students understand prepositions like *on, under*;

next to, and *above*, but also encouraged them to use these words in sentences, boosting their language skills. Further students made creative sentences using preposition words.

The concept introduction of *Clothes We Wear* in EVS was done through a touch and feel activity using various types of clothing. This hands-on sensory activity was designed to help young learners understand the concept of texture, recognize different types of fabrics, and develop their descriptive vocabulary. The experience was both educational and fun, engaging students in a tactile exploration of the materials we encounter in our daily lives. Also, we conducted an engaging and educational activity where students were tasked with drawing or pasting different types of clothes worn in the summer season on an A3 sheet. This creative exercise not only introduced students to various types of clothing but also encouraged them to think about the different occasions and seasons when these clothes are worn. It was a fun way to integrate creativity, cultural awareness, and an understanding of everyday life. Chapter of *Our Festivals*, the students participated in an exciting Show and Tell activity where students were invited to draw their favorite festivals on A4 sheets. This creative session allowed the children to explore their artistic skills, express their cultural experiences, and share the joy of celebrating festivals with their classmates. It was a wonderful opportunity for students to learn about the diverse traditions and celebrations that make each festival special.

Teaching young students about money is an essential part of their early education, helping them develop basic math skills and financial literacy. To make this learning experience fun and interactive, students engaged in a Dummy Note activity as part of the chapter on money. This hands-on activity allowed students to explore the concept of money, understand its value, and practice using it in real-life scenarios, to help students recognize and identify different currency notes, to teach them how to count money, make purchases, and understand the idea of saving. To boost students' confidence in handling money through role-playing and interactive learning. The *Let us do Shopping activity* was organized to teach students how to use and calculate money.

Geeta Mahotsav was celebrated by Grade I students where young learners came together to honor and learn about the teachings of the Bhagavad Gita, a sacred Hindu scripture. Short questions session and quiz was conducted by the Hindi teacher to enhance their learning about the Bhagavad Gita.

Continuing with the Space Workshop, students gathered at the school for an exciting and educational moon watch event as part of the space workshop. The event aimed to foster a deeper understanding of astronomy and ignite curiosity about the wonders of the night sky. As the sun set, students eagerly gathered outside with telescopes to observe the moon and other celestial objects. They were guided by teachers, who explained the different phases of the moon. The workshop also included discussions about space exploration, helping students connect what they saw in the sky with real-world scientific discoveries.
