These activities made them aware of the real hero and encouraged patriotism and a sense of national pride among students.

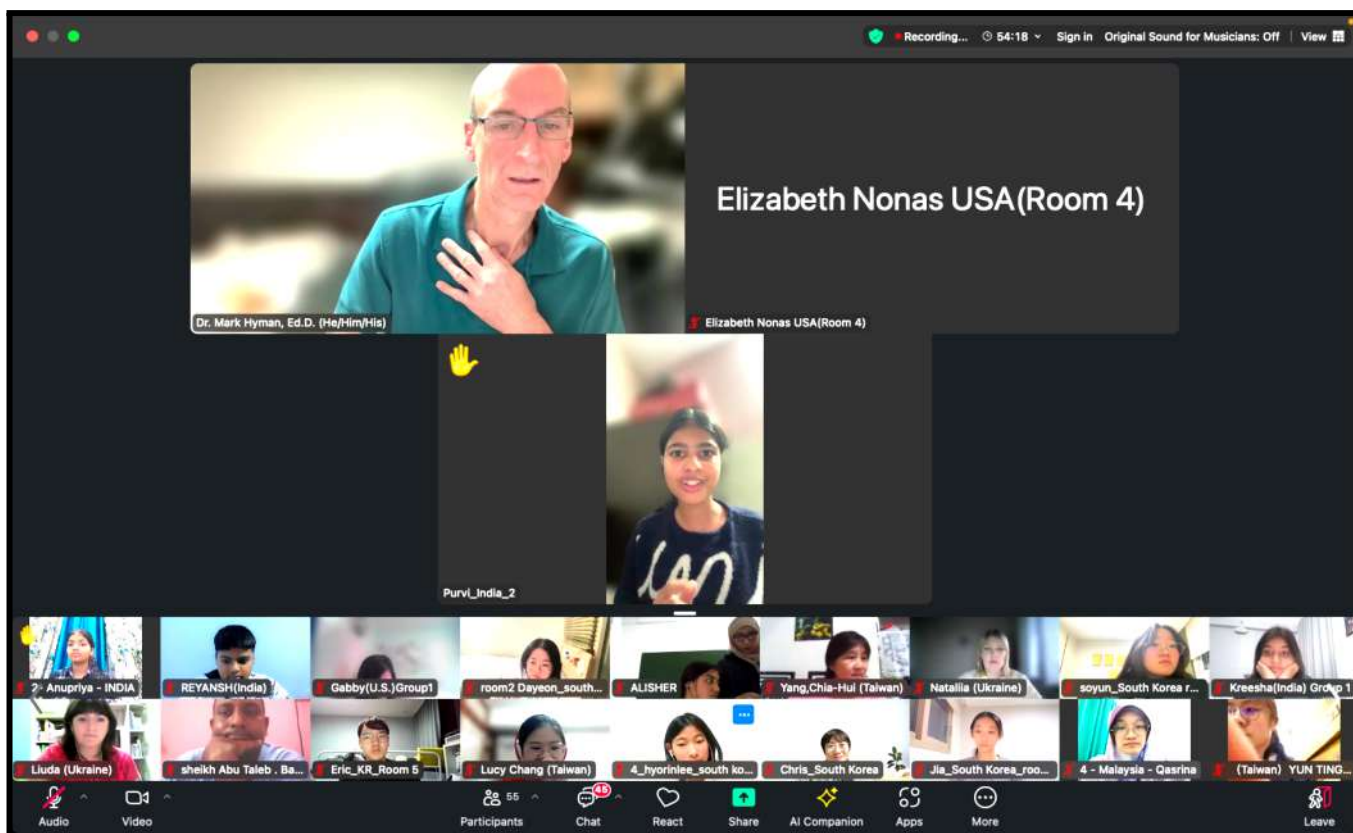

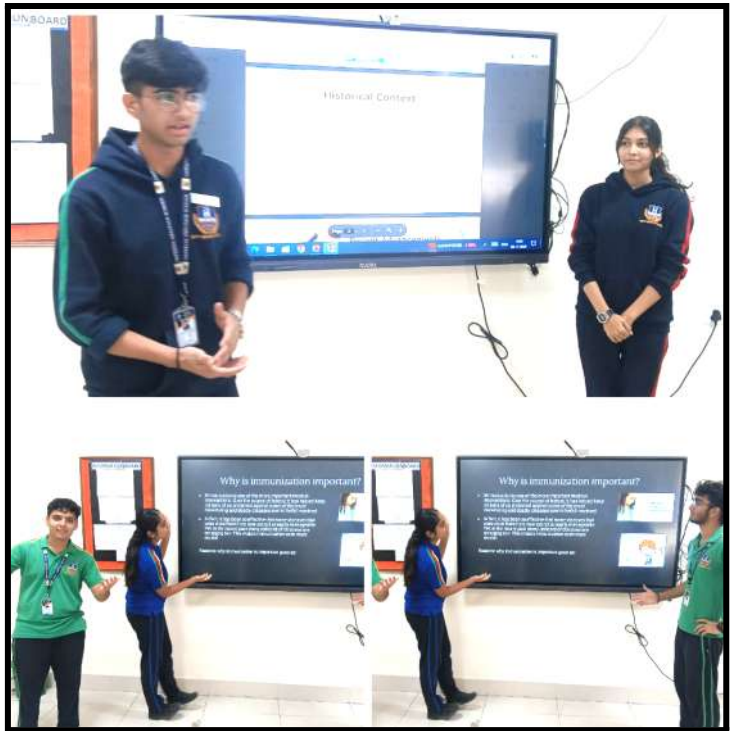

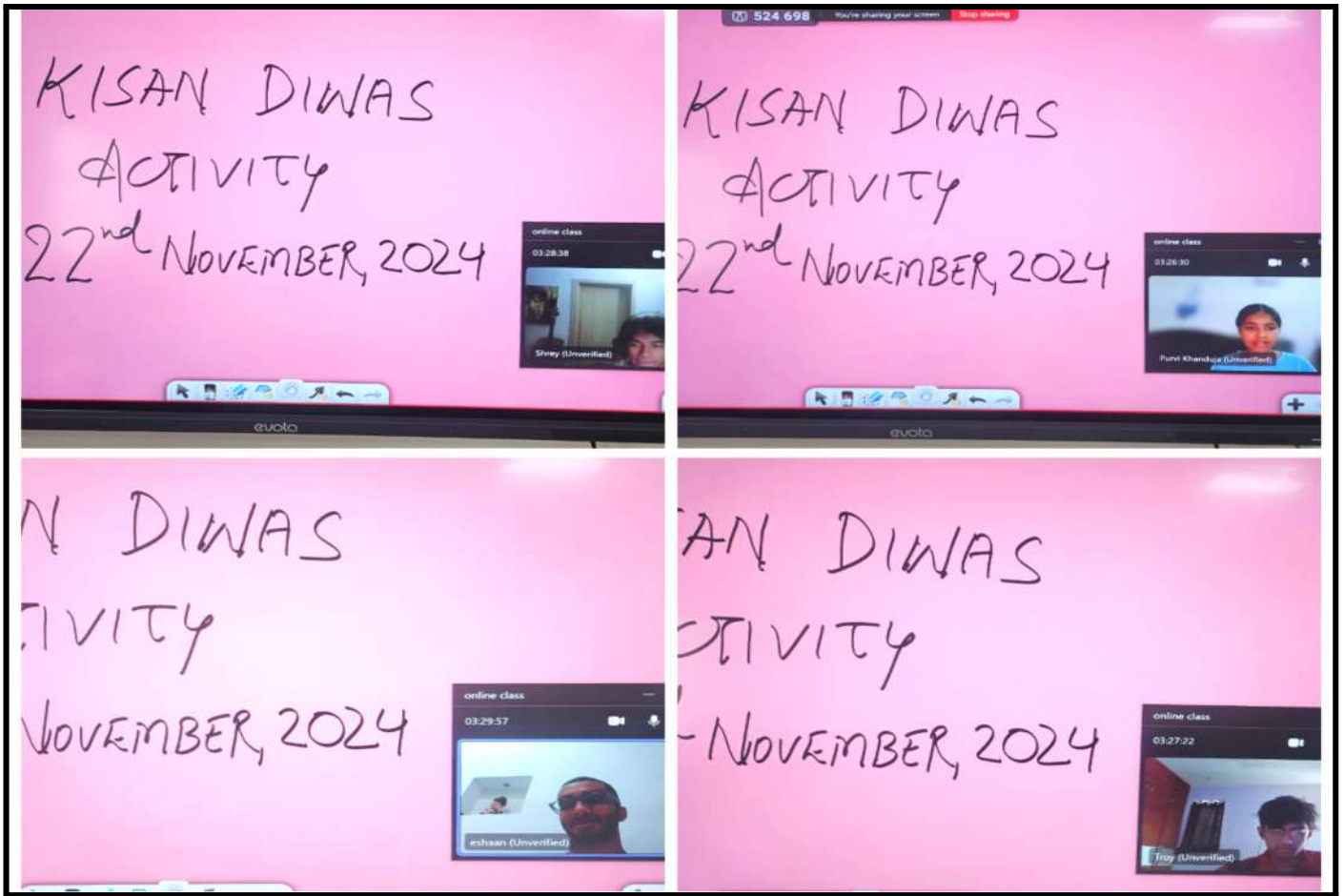
