Students actively participated in engaging classroom activities that brought these concepts to life. The highlight of the workshop was an outdoor session, where students had the chance to observe different planets through a telescope, adding a real-world dimension to their learning experience.

In **Math** students created a vibrant **decimal place value chart** and colored it beautifully, making it a joyful learning experience. Through this activity, they gained a strong understanding of decimal numbers, including reading, writing, and performing all operations with decimals. Their engagement with the chart not only enhanced their comprehension but also made learning decimals interactive and enjoyable. To reinforce the concept of place value and **measurement units**, students were involved in a hands-on activity like drawing a ladder to represent the sequence. Through this way, they not only visualize the relationships between units (like kilometers to meters, grams to kilograms, etc.) but also understand how to convert between them.

In EVS, the students have drawn and coloured beautiful pictures of a Kutcha house and a Pucca House. They learnt about the types of houses people live in, based on the materials used and the environment. It is a great way to help them visually understand the difference between these two types of houses. Apart from this, they have also drawn beautiful pictures of different categories of animals - arboreal, terrestrial, nocturnal, amphibian, aquatic and aerial. Drawing pictures of animals from various categories not only nurtures creativity but also deepens understanding of the animal kingdom and their habitats. In addition, it helps children appreciate how animals adapt to their environments.

A **Handwriting Competition** was recently held, where students had the opportunity to showcase their best handwriting skills. Participants presented their writing with precision and style.
