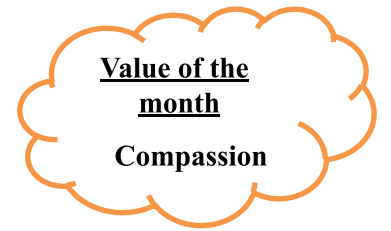

### 3. General Information
