It will give us all an opportunity to demonstrate our commitment to the school as we witness the most anticipated event, the ‘**Annual Fest**’. Let us all welcome December with passion and zeal.

November has been a time for executing preparations for the “School Annual Carnival Celebrations.” This year, like the Annual Day Celebration, we began preparing well in advance for the annual fest. Students across all grades are busy with their regular practice sessions for the event, and teachers are working equally hard to make this event a grand success.

Here is a look at what transpired in **November**:

National Unity Day:“Run for Unity” is an annual event held to celebrate the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel on October 31st, also known as Rashtriya Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day). It serves as a reminder of Patel's pivotal role in unifying India after independence and highlights the importance of preserving national harmony. Students participated in the "Run for Unity" – a mass run to promote national integration, unity, and solidarity.

Inter House Competition:The inter-house competition on the Ramayan focused on promoting teamwork and knowledge of the epic through a dance-drama performance. Each house showcased its understanding of the characters, values, and teachings of the Ramayana, fostering a spirit of healthy competition and cultural appreciation. The event highlighted the timeless relevance of the Ramayan’s lessons in today’s world.

World Immunization Day:Immunization is a primary component of healthcare and an indisputable human right. World Immunization Day, observed on November 10th each year, aims to raise awareness about the importance of vaccination. To mark the day, students explored the vital role vaccines play in maintaining public health. Through posters, discussions, and informative presentations, they learned how vaccines work, their impact on eradicating diseases, and the importance of widespread immunization. This activity emphasized the role of vaccines in protecting individuals and communities.

Children’s Day:Children's Day is observed on November 14th, the birthday of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, who believed in the importance of nurturing children to shape a better future. IHS celebrated this special day to honor and promote the well-being and education of children through a bagless day with various activities, events, and programs that encouraged creativity, fun, and learning.

Birsa Munda's birth anniversary: Birsa Munda's birth anniversary is celebrated on November 15th to honor the life and legacy of the prominent tribal freedom fighter and social leader from Jharkhand, India. He is remembered for his deep connection to nature, spirituality, and his vision of a just society for tribal communities. Birsa Munda is often referred to as “Dharti Aba” (Father of the Earth) by the Munda tribe and remains a symbol of tribal identity and pride. His birth anniversary was celebrated at IHS by highlighting his contributions to India’s independence movement and the empowerment of tribal communities.

Kisaan Diwas :Kisaan Diwas is celebrated in India on December 23rd each year to honor the contributions of farmers to the nation’s economy and recognize their vital role in ensuring food security. The day marks the birth anniversary of Chaudhary Charan Singh, the fifth Prime Minister of India, who was a strong advocate for farmers' welfare. Kisaan Diwas serves as a reminder of the importance of agriculture in India’s

development and the need to address issues facing farmers, such as fair pricing, access to resources, and sustainable farming practices. The students of VI A and VI B participated in an individual activity highlighting the ongoing challenges in the agriculture sector, promoting awareness and solidarity with farmers across the country.

Space Workshop: During the workshop, students explored key terminologies and principles related to rocket science and aerodynamics, such as payload, center of mass, center of pressure, command module, and fuel chamber. They gained insights into various rocket components, including the nose cone, rocket body, types of fuel, and the role of fins in stabilizing a rocket during flight. The workshop concluded with an exciting ‘Evening Rendezvous with the Sky.’

Road Safety Quiz: Students participated in a road safety quiz that assessed their knowledge and awareness about the rules to be followed while on road or travelling organised by Haryana police.

Geeta Mahotsav: The Antarrashtriya Geeta Mahotsav was celebrated with great enthusiasm through the Geeta Vachan Competition.

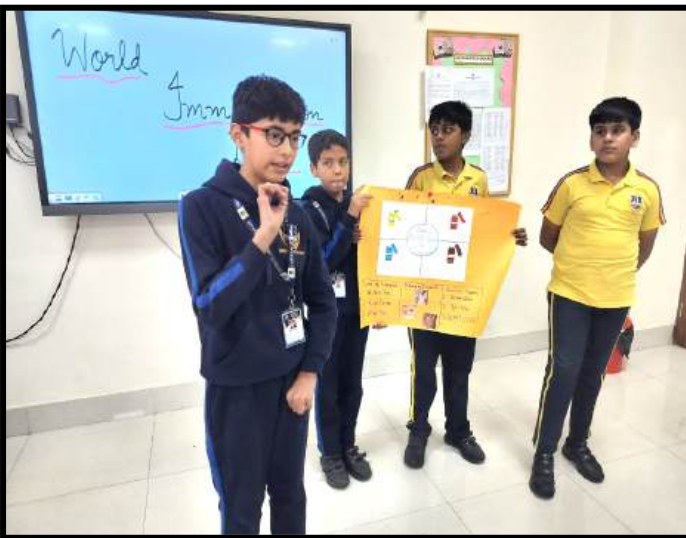
Subject Enrichment Activities: In **Math**, students of Grade VI went out to the field and applied their knowledge of area and perimeter. They identified squares and rectangles around them and measured the dimensions using measuring tapes. Then they calculated the area and perimeter of these objects. In **English**, the students combined literature with creative visualisation of the stories through posters for ‘Children At Work’ and concept map for ‘Robinson Crusoe’.

Value of the Month: This month, we focused on fostering *honesty* by encouraging students to engage in honest interactions through small daily or weekly challenges. 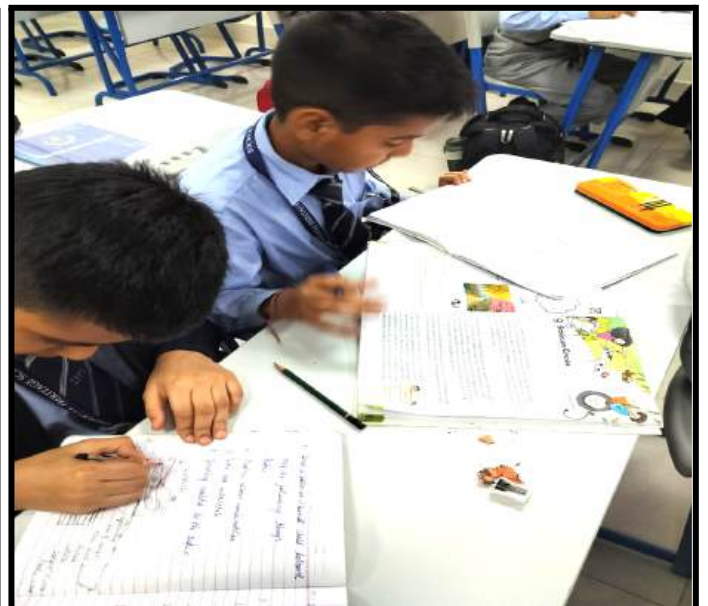
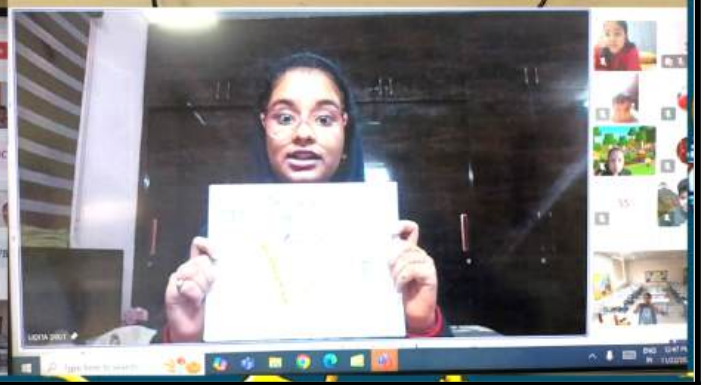

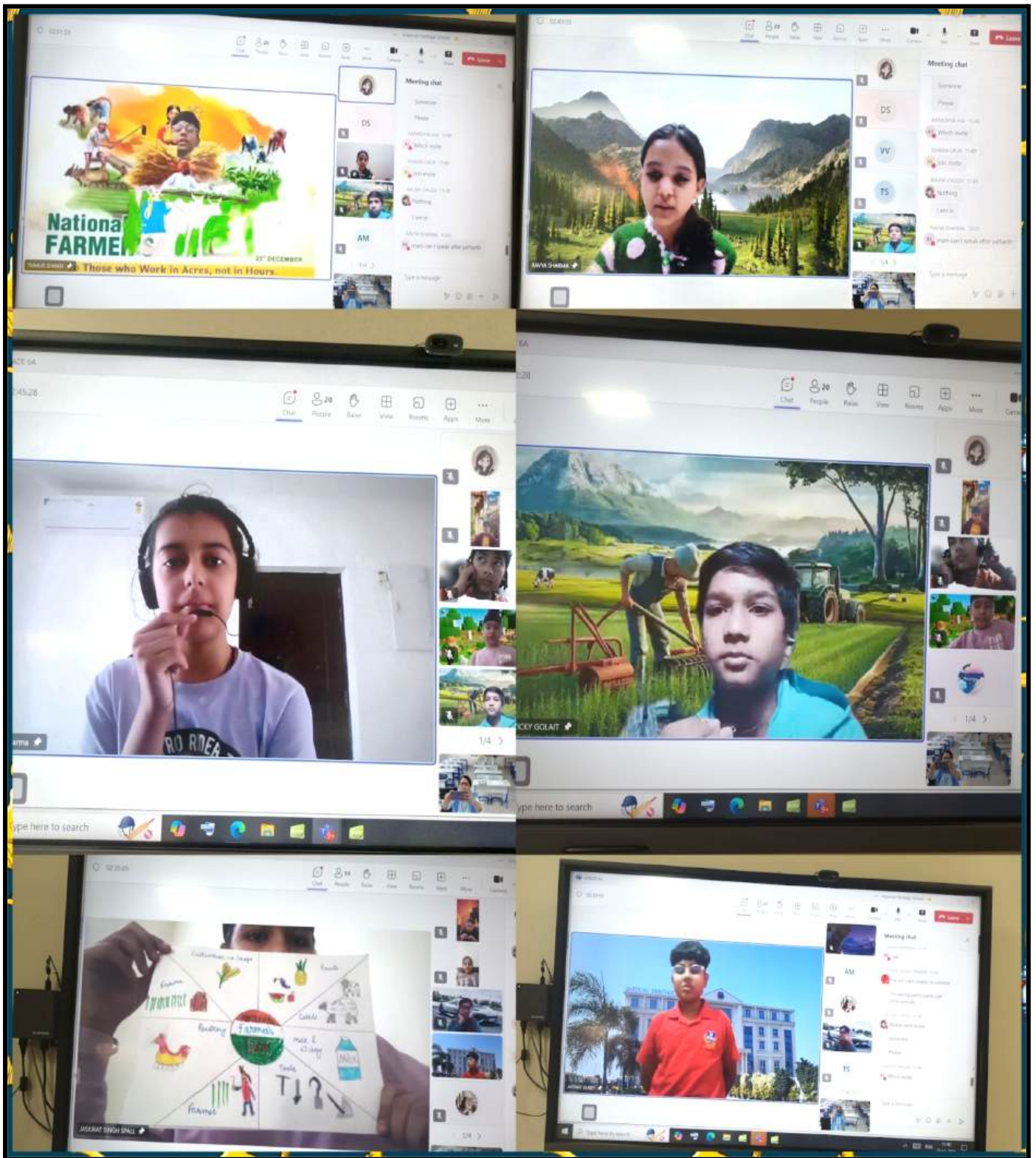
