Unity Run: The students of IHS participated in the unity run. The Unity Run is an annual event that takes place on Rashtriya Ekta Diwas or National Unity Day, to honor Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and his contributions to unite India after independence. Students displayed exceptional energy and team spirit, cheering each other throughout the event.

Assembly on Tsunami: Students came together for an informative assembly focused on learning about tsunamis. They learned about the causes, impact, and safety measures related to this natural disaster. Through presentations and visual aids, students gained insights into how tsunamis affect coastal communities and the importance of disaster preparedness.

Inter House Competition (Ramayana Comes Alive): This dynamic competition brought the timeless tales of the Ramayana to life, as students from each house performed key scenes with enthusiasm and creativity. Their enactments highlighted the moral and cultural values embedded in the epic, allowing students to explore their heritage in a meaningful and engaging way. This activity emphasized the role of vaccines in protecting individuals and communities.

Children's Day Celebration: IHS celebrated this special day to honor and promote the well-being and education of children through bagless day with various activities, events, and programs that encouraged creativity, fun, and learning. The celebration featured Zumba, a movie screening, outdoor sports, and art and pottery sessions. Students enthusiastically participated, showcasing their creativity and teamwork, making it a memorable and joyful event for everyone involved.

Space Workshop : A captivating space workshop engaged students across grades, fostering curiosity and interest in space exploration. Students open the door to a world full of endless possibilities when they explore the sky through a TELESCOPE! They discovered that some of the stars in the night sky were actually planets. They were amazed to see the features of the moon and planets, Saturn rings, phases of Venus. Through fun activities they understood how craters on the moon were formed and why the moon alternates between a Waxing and Waning Phase. This enriching experience inspired young minds to explore the vastness of space, sparking a passion for discovery and learning. Students developed a deeper understanding of space, its wonders, and complexities.

Road Safety Quiz: As part of the ongoing efforts to promote awareness about road safety, the students participated in a Road Safety Quiz :Round -1, organised by Traffic Police, Haryana. The activity aimed to educate students about traffic rules, safe practices, and the importance of responsible behavior on roads.
