showcasing its dynamic and textured surface. They also observed the planets Saturn, and Venus through telescopes. This hands-on experience ignited their curiosity and deepened their understanding of the wonders of the cosmos. The session was truly a memorable journey into the mysteries of space, inspiring young minds to explore the universe beyond.

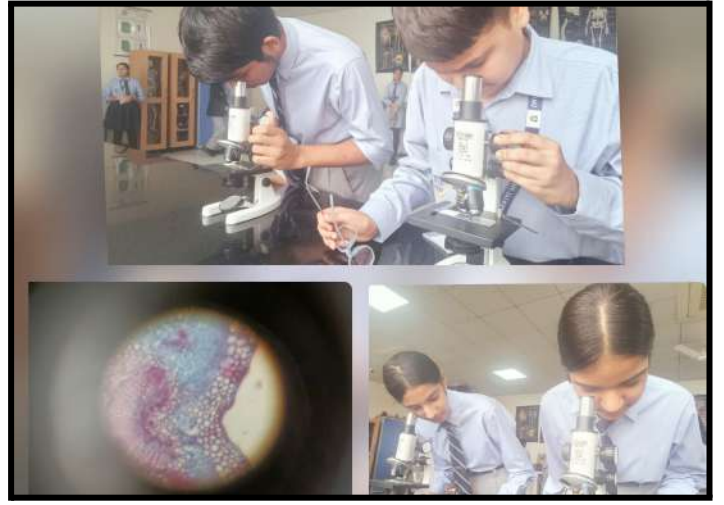
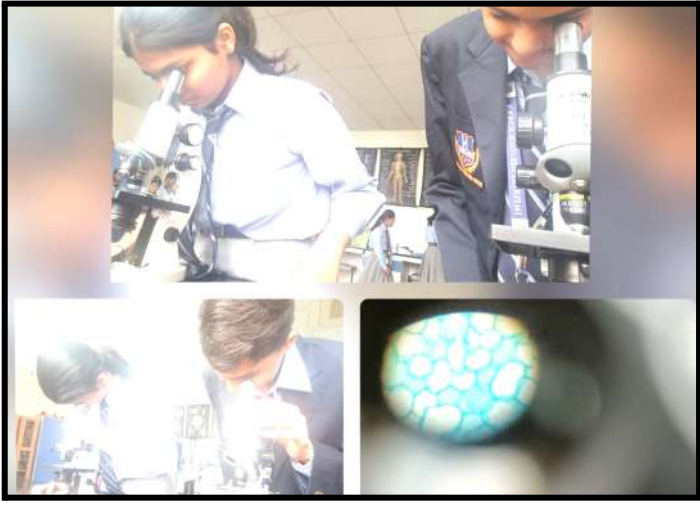

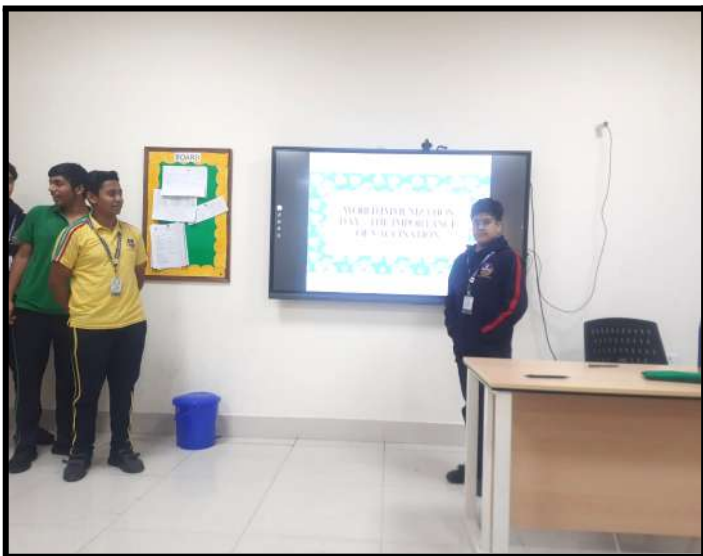
