Making learning fun, they also enjoyed online games like Spin the Wheel, Word Wall and quizzes.

In Environmental Studies (EVS) theme, students explored the fascinating world of 'Seasons'. They learned about different types of seasons- spring and summer. The curriculum also included the food, clothes, weather, and climate enjoyed during these seasons. They enjoyed learning through the bulletin board as they visually understood more and did a hands-on activity as theme craft related to seasons which helped to enhance their creative and learning skills.

Students were beautifully dressed in pink and created a pink origami butterfly craft. They also eagerly talked out different pink items that they had in their class and at home.

The value of the month was Honesty. It teaches us reliability, being trust worthy, and showing respect for others. The meaning and understanding were explained to the students through stories and real-life examples.

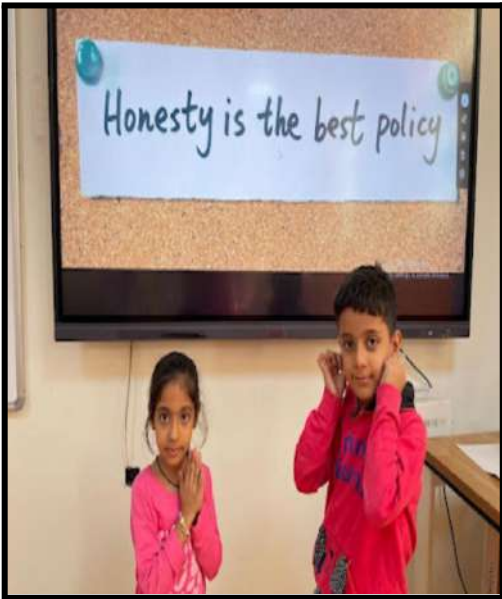
