Clay, A4 sheets, paper/ thermocal plate, glue, cotton balls, ear buds.

★Instructions: -

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- Take different colours (brown, green, yellow) clay and a white A4 sheet.
- To demonstrate seed germination through clay, begin by molding the clay materials into small seeds, baby plant, leaves and a flower.
- Paste the clay seeds, plants, leaves, and flower with the help of glue according to the stage they appear in the story on the A4sheet.

• Finally cut the A4 sheet in circle and paste it on paper/thermocol plate.

ACTIVITY 2

PARTS OF PLANTS: - (MY UNIQUE PLANT)

Creating a *Unique Plant Project* will be both fun and educational. Here's an idea for a project that combines creativity and learning. Objective of this project is to introduce kids to the www.world of plants through creative hands-on experiential learning.

🌣 <u>Materials required: -</u>

Apper cups, Googly eyes, colour, glue, ear buds, to paint spikes and colours.

Instructions: -

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- Create a 3D plant (Paste origami sheet post cutting desired shape
- Paste it in paper cup
- Draw roots in cup
- Your unique plant is ready

Project 2 (Roll numbers 13 to 25)

Materials required: -

Cardboard, Googly eyes, colour, glue, ear buds,
ice cream stick to make the trunk and stems of the tree,
joogly eyes, scissors, origami sheets, glitter dust and colours.

Instructions: -

Create a 3D Seasons Tree: -

- To make a season tree craft, start by gathering brown, green, red, orange, and yellow origami paper, scissors, glue, and a brown marker.
- Cut a tree trunk and branches from the brown paper and glue ice cream sticks on it and give it a trunk look.
- Cut out leaves in various colors and shapes from the other papers.
- Arrange and glue the leaves onto the branches to represent each
- Season green for Spring, red and orange for Autumn, and yellow for Summer.
- Use the brown marker to add details to the tree trunk.
- You can also decorate your tree with fine glitter dust by making small fruits or flowers on leaves.



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ACTIVITY 3 LEAF- AN INTERESTING PART OF A PLANT

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Encouraging children to explore nature by observing different types of leaves and their unique characteristics. Such as

- Promoting creativity by allowing children to experiment with colors, textures, and patterns found in nature.
- Developing fine motor skills through the process of collecting leaves, arranging them, and making impressions.
- Introducing basic concepts of plant identification, such as leaf shapes, sizes, and vein patterns.
- Allowing children to express themselves artistically by creating their own leaf impressions.
- Developing observation skills as children closely examine leaves to understand their unique characteristics.
- Environmental awareness: Fostering an appreciation for nature and the environment by exploring natural materials and their beauty.

Materials required: -

- A3 sheet (white)
- Acrylics colour for leaf impression
- Black colour pencil

Instructions: -

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- Go for a nature walk and collect beautiful leaves of different shapes.
- Dip them into colour of your choice and create a beautiful sequence of leaf impressions on a white A3 sheet.
- Draw the veins with black colour pencil.



ACTIVITY 4 WHAT WE GET FROM PLANTS

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From the trees to the flowers, plants are essential to life on our planet. They provide us food, fibre, shelter, medicine, and fuel. Let us explore the different things that plants give us.

☆Materials required

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- Thermacol Plate
- Colour pencils
- A3 sheets
- Ice cream sticks



☆Instructions: -

- Draw and colour your favorite food items which we get from plants.
- Categorize the food items into roots, fruits, leaves, seeds, flowers, stems and leaves
- Paste your drawings around the plate categorically with the help of ice cream sticks.

ACTIVITY 5 MY SECRET DIARY

☆Instructions:

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
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- Summer Holidays are fun, yet there are some days that are better than the others.

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- Colored paper (green for stems and leaves, assorted colors for flowers)
- Scissors
- Glue
- Markers or crayons
- Ice- cream sticks

Instructions:

- Prepare the Flowers- Cut out flower shapes from the colored paper. You can make different types of flowers using different shapes like circles, ovals, or petals.
- Cut as many flowers as the letters of your name.
- Write each letter of your name on each flower.
- Create the Stems and Leaves- Cut long strips of green paper for the stems.
- Cut out leaf shapes from the green paper. You can make simple oval or teardrop shapes.
- Assemble the Flowers- Insert the stems through the slits in the flowers. Secure the flowers in place with glue.
- Attach the leaves to the stems using glue.

- Glue, paper

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
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- Googly eyes

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
