Baisakhi is a vibrant harvest festival celebrated in the Indian state of Punjab. It marks the beginning of the new harvest season and is considered one of the most significant festivals for Sikhs. A special assembly on Baisakhi was conducted by senior students. In addition to this, students also made a beautiful card depicting Baisakhi.

The value of the month was **RESPONSIBILITY** for living things which was discussed through discussions and role plays and activities. Students learnt how to be responsible at school, home and to mother earth. Moreover, moral values were also inculcated during the regular teaching-learning process.

Children also did a lot of hands-on activities in different subjects to understand various concepts which were introduced to them. In **English** related to the Chapter-1 "Ice Cream Man" students did an activity where they brought their favourite flavours to life by creating colourful popsicles and associating them with their preferred colours. This creative exercise helped them connect with the chapter's themes in a tangible and delicious way! In addition to this related to Chapter-1 in Grammar- Sentences, students played engaging games and unscrambled sentences to develop their language skills. They also showcased their creativity by drawing their dream houses and writing short descriptions, bringing their imaginations to life. In addition, while learning about subject and predicate, students made awesome collages with tons of pictures. Then, they wrote sentences about them and identified subjects and predicates in those sentences. These activities not only made learning enjoyable but also helped our students develop essential skills in a playful and interactive environment. We're proud of their enthusiasm and creativity! The students also celebrated English World Day where they created a word wall and wrote different words for each letter. The activity was highly engaging and everyone worked collaboratively.

In **E.V.S**, students made a family tree related to the chapter – My Family. Through this activity, they were sensitised about big, joint and nuclear families. They were also explained the importance of showing love and care towards their elders. In addition to this, they did an activity related to the Chapter- We Care in which students wrote the first letter of their name with raised dots and they felt it with their closed eyes to understand the Braille script. Students also did role play on people with disabilities and gained a deeper understanding of the lives of disabled people. Related to the chapter-Games We Play, students creatively made their favourite indoor and outdoor games on paper and discussed the same with their peers. Moreover, to relive olden times children gathered in the playground to relive the joy of traditional games like Kho Kho, Kabaddi, Five Stones, and Tug of War. These games not only brought them immense fun but also connected them to the simpler, joyous times of the past.

In **Mathematics** students were introduced to the concept of Large Numbers in which they did a place value neighbour activity in which they formed neighbours with the help of house cutouts and formed large numbers by drawing an abacus. During our visits to the Maths lab, we explored various hands-on activities designed to enhance our understanding of addition and subtraction. In My Box of Straws activity students formed large numbers by putting straws in place value holders and then adding and subtracting the numbers.

In **Hindi** they did an activity in which children dressed up in attire of different states and spoke a few lines about the respective state.

Our students also participated in the 1st Inter Invitational Skating Championship and 2nd Inter Invitation Athletics Championship hosted by Buddha International School, Gurugram on 3rd May '2024 where students of Grade III secured positions in Athletics and Skating.
