Value of the month was **RESPONSIBILITY** towards living things and our Earth. Students watched videos on responsibility and engaged in discussions about their role in protecting the environment. They then wrote down five key responsibilities on an A4 sheet to demonstrate their commitment to environmental safety. By embracing these responsibilities, students are actively contributing to a healthier and more sustainable planet.

Baisakhi is a vibrant harvest festival celebrated in the Indian state of Punjab. It marks the beginning of the new harvest season and is considered one of the most significant festivals for Sikhs. A special assembly on Baisakhi was conducted by senior students. In addition to this, students also made a beautiful card depicting Baisakhi.

The academic front made learning interesting through various hands-on activities in all the subjects to understand various concepts. In **Math** an activity was done on Roman Numerals by using earbuds to represent the different symbols. The activity involved arranging the earbuds to form numerals such as I, V, X, L, C, D, and M. By physically manipulating the earbuds, students gained a clearer comprehension of how Roman numerals are built and used in combination to represent various numbers. The exercise also fostered teamwork and creativity as students worked together to form larger numbers and solve numeral-based puzzles. Overall, this interactive activity made learning Roman numerals fun and memorable for the students. An activity of Addition and Subtraction properties was also conducted where they penned down the properties in A4 colorful sheets thereby understanding the concept very thoroughly with the help of various examples given. The activity concluded with interactive sessions by the students stating all the properties of Addition and Subtraction.

In **EVS** students were engaged in a fun and interactive learning experience! In Chapter 1 - My Family, students began by creating 'mini-me's' and then made family puppets and spoke a few lines on them. In addition to this in Chapter 2 - The Young Ones, students drew various animals and categorized them based on their reproduction methods, placing them in their correct positions in a model. They also explored the concept of adoption through a role-play activity. Moreover, In Chapter 3 - Our Extended Family, students created a booklet titled 'Welcome to My Extended Family' by drawing pictures of their paternal and maternal grandparents and sharing a few lines about the values and traditions they learned from each other. Students celebrated **English World Day** where they collectively worked on Word Wall and wrote different words for each letter. In addition, the month of April also hosted an Inter House Competition and Intra Class poem recitation competition to celebrate Environment Week with the aim of developing their awareness about the environment issues. Students participated enthusiastically and won everyone's heart with their excellent performance.

On the last working day students enjoyed a class party with home made snacks and food and shared with their friends and teachers.

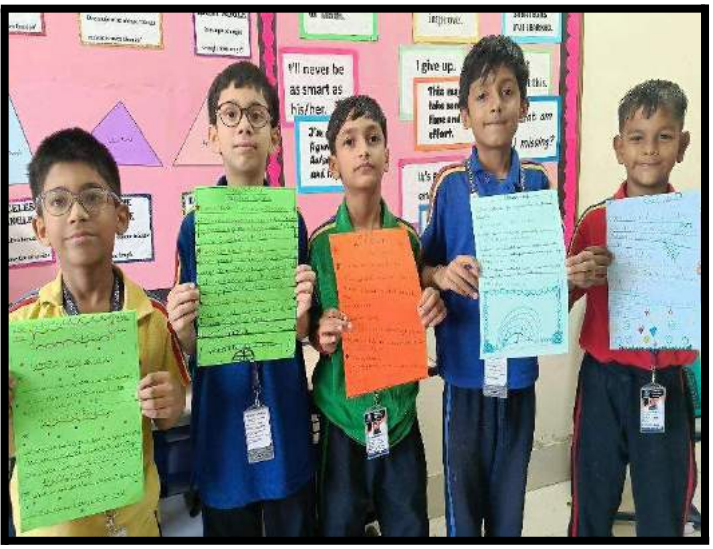
