Dear Parents,

Welcome back! We hope your children had a fantastic vacation and are returning to school energised and ready for a new month of learning and play.

The start of the new session was full of mixed emotions- apprehension mixed with excitement and it was a pleasure to witness the growth and enthusiasm of our students in their learning journey.

April began with excitement as students settled into their new classrooms and engaged in various craft activities in the first week. They made a welcome card, crafted their personal table mat and made a special crown for themselves. They enjoyed these activities immensely, making their first week of school fun and memorable.

Students also celebrated the festival of Baisakhi with a special wheat pasting craft. The children learned about the importance of Baisakhi and its significance. This festival, which marks the beginning of the harvest season, provided a wonderful opportunity for our students to understand cultural traditions and their relevance.

The month of April played host to Environment Week where our students explored the importance of our planet through engaging activities. They engaged in a group activity of Happy Earth and Sad Earth where they pasted different items on the 3D models of two earths to showcase what makes the planet happy and sad. Through this they learned how to keep our Earth clean and green, emphasising the importance of not wasting water and electricity, not cutting down trees, and planting more trees. The students also created a frog habitat to understand the concept of habitats better and how habitats are impacted with global warming, thus causing harm to animals. An Awareness Rally by the Pre Primary Wing was organized around the school corridors to promote the feeling of responsibility towards the environment, highlighting small steps that each one of us can do.

Dance is a wonderful way to express emotions, and our students showcased their dance moves during the International Dance Day Intra-Class Dance Competition. They performed with enthusiasm and excitement, demonstrating their preparedness and talent. Dance not only helps in physical development but also in building confidence and expressing creativity.

The world is made up of different colours and each colour has a significance. Green symbolises faith and prosperity, and the students celebrated Green Colour Day by learning about different shades of green in the environment around them. During discussions, they recollected the different green fruits and vegetables that they were aware of. Making an association with their surroundings, they brought a green item from home and pointed out many more in their classroom. Students also enjoyed the Jungle Maze activity and a fun-filled Peas craft to reinforce their understanding of the colour green.

The theme for the month was All About Me, focusing on understanding themselves, their body parts and their functions, five senses, and exploring family dynamics. Students engaged in discussions on different body parts and enjoyed various kinesthetic activities during circle time where they got an opportunity to use different parts of the body. They also participated in a group activity to understand sense organs and appreciate how each organ is important. Students enjoyed pottery class where they created family members with clay, emphasising their understanding of family structures and the roles of each member. They also learned about their houses and rooms inside their homes, personal hygiene, and how to keep themselves clean. Focusing on personal hygiene, the students were taught the importance of regular handwashing, brushing teeth, and maintaining cleanliness to stay healthy. In pre-Math skills, students learnt about the concept of big and small. They engaged in activities to understand size differences, spatial sense, and classifying and sorting. They participated in a group activity to better understand big and small objects.

To embrace the summer season, the students enjoyed a summer fruit party filled with refreshing fruit, sharing their favourite fruit with their friends. They learnt about different summer fruits, their benefits, and the importance of staying hydrated and healthy during the hot weather. Mother's Day was a heartwarming celebration where students and their mothers joined together for a special Cooking Without Fire activity. The children showcased their love and appreciation through dance and song performances. This event strengthened the bond between mothers and children, creating beautiful memories and reinforcing the values of love and gratitude.

The value of the months of April and May was responsibility and students learnt about the same by looking after their school playground. They had an interactive discussion first with their teachers on why the playground should be kept clean and how they like to go to have fun in neat and clean grounds. Then they went to the school playground and spent time putting away all the equipment that they played with so that the ground was neat for the next class. Inculcating values at a young age helps build a strong foundation.

To conclude the month, students enjoyed a delightful class party, sharing food and creating last memories as they spent time with their friends and teachers. We look forward to another exciting month ahead, filled with more learning, fun, and memorable experiences.
