The day became even more special as senior students took on the role of teachers, leading the younger classes in an enriching experience. The student council also planned a variety of fun activities and skits, offering a playful yet meaningful tribute to their beloved teachers. It was a day full of warmth and respect, setting a joyful tone for the rest of the month. Students also gave beautiful handmade cards to their teachers as a token of their love and respect.

Students celebrated International Literacy Day wherein they enjoyed weaving their own stories with the pictures given to them. Each student participated in building their stories using pictures, voice modulations, and hand movements. This activity encouraged them to collaborate and build on each other’s ideas as well.

Swacchta Pakhwada Week was celebrated in school to create awareness about the importance of cleanliness of ourselves and our surroundings. They took a cleanliness pledge, promising to keep their surroundings clean, and engaged in a practical hand-washing activity to learn the proper method of maintaining hygiene. This initiative not only made students aware of the importance of cleanliness but also instilled in them a sense of responsibility toward their environment.

Students of Grade I- A presented a wonderful morning assembly. They started the day with the Gayatri Mantra followed by news from in and around the world. They culminated with a current affairs quiz which was a fun exercise for all. In addition students of Grade I- B showcased an amazing morning assembly depicting the importance of Hindi Diwas. They spoke about the importance of this day and presented an amazing poem on it. Hindi Diwas is celebrated every year on 14th of September, and the students learned about the importance of our National language by reciting a poem along with props about Hindi Diwas.

First Aid Day was also celebrated and the school nurse told the students about the importance of first aid in case of any medical emergency around them. Students made their own medical first aid box consisting of all the necessary items. To celebrate River Day, students were told the importance of saving rivers along with slogan writing on the same was done. Later on, students went on a water drive throughout the school campus spreading awareness about saving rivers.

In Numeracy students enjoyed knowing about shapes and differentiating solid and flat shapes. They learned about solid shapes in detail by experiencing and making 3D shapes using sticks and clay dough. They were also shown different real-life 3D items for better understanding of the shapes. In EVS, the concept of Air

and Weather and its properties were explained through various experiments. Students were asked to blow air and move the paper of their book, while the fans were switched off, to feel the presence of air. Making an association with trees providing oxygen which is present in the air, they also made a poster on 'Do not cut Trees' to spread awareness about trees. In English, the concept of pronouns was introduced through a video, where students enjoyed listening to the story and learning about the same. Students made a garden of pronouns, where the flowers showcased different pronouns learned.
