Words I Know: To celebrate the International Literacy Day students of Grade VI participated in "Words I Know" activity wherein they had to write as many words as possible in 5 minutes. As the timer ticked, heartbeats quickened. Some showed cleverness by copying words from a book, some from ID cards, and some even from classroom boards. The highest numbers of words written were 108, 101, 106, 101, and 99.

Wild Wisdom Global Challenge: Students from Grades VI to IX eagerly participated in the Wild Wisdom Global Challenge 2024, an initiative by WWF-India. This year's theme, **Reptiles: The Ultimate Scaly Survivalists**, invites students to delve into the world of reptiles, exploring their remarkable diversity while dispelling common myths. Through this challenge, students could uncover the fascinating traits, adaptations, and behaviors that have allowed reptiles to thrive for millions of years. The top 30 scorers from the first round advanced to the WWGC School Level Challenge, where the two top performers from the school will qualify for the next stage, the State Level Round. 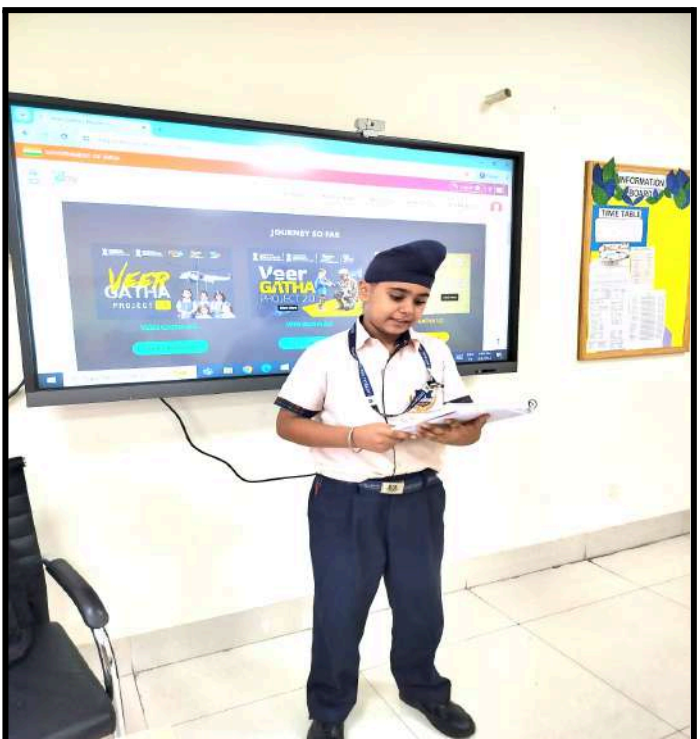
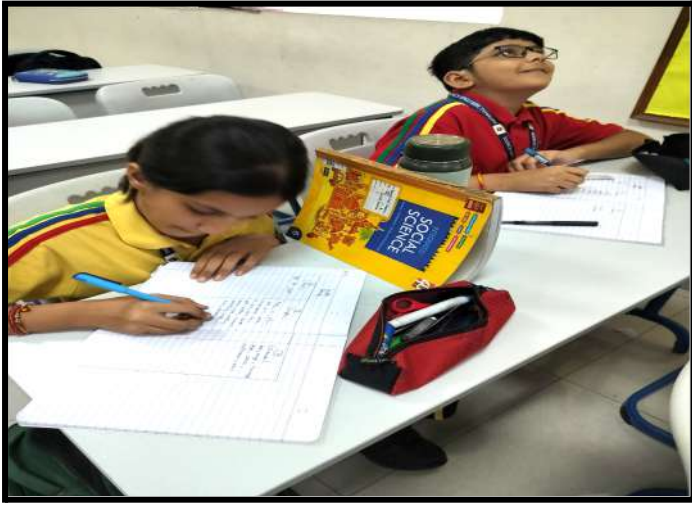

CBSE Reading Challenge- Congratulations to Ananya and Shivaansh Yadav for making it to Round 2 of the CBSE Reading Challenge in Hindi & English respectively! The students showed their reading skills in a stipulated time limit and answered relevant questions.

Subject Enrichment Activities: In Science, students learned about and observed the different parts of Hibiscus flowers through dissection. In English, students completed the revision of the English syllabus through written work. Key points on how to frame answers, supported by relevant examples, were shared. They enjoyed analyzing "The Pied Piper of Hamelin" and also learned about notice writing. In Social Studies, educational videos, interactive sessions, revision worksheets, and open-book assessments helped the students recall the concepts they had learned and present them both verbally and in writing. In Mathematics they solved different types of questions in the class.

Value of the Month: To instill the importance of Hard Work among students, they were encouraged to set specific academic goals for their Term 1 Exams and create action plans to achieve them. They were encouraged to maintain record to reflect on their study habits, challenges, and progress throughout the preparation period.
