A poster-making activity related to 'Single Use Plastic' was organized, where students showcased their creativity and commitment to cleanliness through beautifully crafted posters. In addition to the artistic expression, a quiz on cleanliness was also held, testing students' knowledge about hygiene, waste management, and the significance of cleanliness in society.
