Hindi Diwas is celebrated every year on **14th September** to commemorate the adoption of Hindi as one of the official languages of India. Our students participated in a **Laghu Katha Lekhan** activity highlighting the importance of Hindi in promoting national unity and preserving cultural heritage.

Under the CBSE reading challenge activity students of Grade IX participated in the Hindi and English language reading challenge. **Tanvi Yadav** and **Priyansh Agarwal** qualified for the second level of the reading challenge competition.

Revision was conducted of the entire syllabus for Term-1, for all the subjects through worksheets, quiz, discussion, class test, etc. CBSE has clearly outlined the significance of speaking and listening skills as part of co-scholastic areas of achievement by every learner. **Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills** was conducted in Grade IX as a part of their subject enrichment activity to assess their proficiency level in the languages with the objective that they are able to interpret what is being said and are able to express themselves well.
