The event was made even more special with a captivating Lord Krishna performance, where the children danced and acted to music, showcasing their talents while honouring the divine stories of Krishna.

In the month of September, our activities were filled with creativity, learning, and celebrations that enhanced both the emotional and cognitive growth of the students. In Literacy the students learned new letters along with their phonic sounds, helping them improve their reading and pronunciation skills. Through fun activities and games, they practiced associating each letter with its corresponding sound, which made the learning process enjoyable and effective.

In Numeracy the focus was on numbers and pre- Math concepts and shapes. The children learned how to count, recognize numbers, and understand basic number relationships. They also explored the concept, of heavy and light, and began to identify and describe shapes like circles, squares, triangles, and rectangles. Using hands-on activities like shape sorting, puzzles, and art, they developed a strong foundation in both numbers and spatial awareness. This holistic approach made learning interactive and meaningful, helping the children develop a better understanding of these fundamental concepts.

Our Colour Burst – PURPLE event was a delightful celebration of colours. The children participated enthusiastically, creating vibrant 3D Grapes Craft. This hands-on activity not only allowed them to explore different shades of purple but also sharpened their fine motor skills and creativity.

In recognition of the importance of safety, we observed First Aid Day, during which our school nurse conducted a talk and PPT presentation. The

students learned basic first aid practices, such as treating minor cuts, burns, and knowing when to seek help from an adult. This valuable session empowered them with the knowledge to handle small emergencies responsibly.

The thematic focus for the month was **Animals**, where students dived into exploring the fascinating world of animals, including their types, habitats, and their young ones. Through engaging stories, rhymes, and crafts, they developed a deeper understanding of the animal kingdom. They learned how different animals live, what they eat, and how they care for their young. The highlight of this theme was the **3D Cow Craft**, where the students not only learned about the cow but also its cultural significance and its vital role in the ecosystem. Creating the 3D cow model gave them a hands-on experience, helping them connect with the lesson in a creative and interactive way. This activity not only reinforced their knowledge about animals but also encouraged their motor skills, imagination, and appreciation for nature.

As part of the World Literacy Day celebration, senior students took the initiative to create letter flashcards for the younger children, helping them recognize letters and their sounds.
