Students also learnt about the Rectangle shape. In Literacy recapitulation of all letters a-z was done through a fun-filled sorting activity. Students learned about vowels-a,e,i,o,u and two letter cluster words with vowel 'a'(at,ab,ad,ag,an,am,ap). To enhance their vocabulary, they learnt sight words. Making learning fun, they also enjoyed singing Krishna songs in English.

September played host to Teachers' Day which was celebrated with great joy and fervor. Students showcased their love towards teachers by giving handmade cards and gifts to their beloved teachers. The day became even more special as senior students took on the role of teachers, leading the younger classes in an enriching experience. 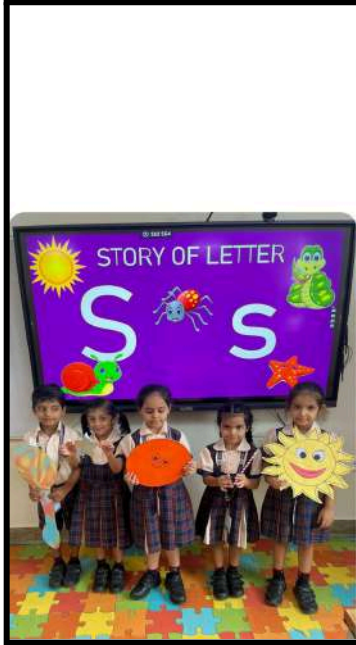
