Greetings!

September indicates that summer isn't over but most of the hot and humid weather is gone. Hello to warm days filled with sunshine and cool nights when open windows bring in fresh air for restful sleeping.

*"Tell me and I forget. Teach me and I remember. Involve me and I learn."* On the academic front, students were taught concepts through activities for better understanding. In Mathematics, the concept of subtraction was introduced through a hands-on activity where students used various objects to grasp the concept of 'taking away'. They watched videos on the same and also used the abacus for better retention of the concept. In English students learnt about the concept of 'is, am, are' which will help them to frame basic grammatically correct sentences. In EVS, students learnt about personal well-being and hygiene through activities and discussions. They also learnt about Food we eat and Plants around us through interactive tools like flashcards, board reading and engaging class discussions. Students were engaged in activities wherein they learnt about different food groups and later on made a greeting card using vegetable printing for their friend or family. For better understanding of plants and trees students went on a nature walk around the school garden. This approach was aimed at familiarizing the students with various types of plants and making them appreciate the importance of the plants and trees in our surroundings.

Grade I presented its first Class Presentation centered around the theme of Community Helpers. They creatively engaged in role-playing activities, embodying various professions that contribute to the community's well-being. Additionally, they showcased their talents by performing a dance routine related to the same theme. Information on different professions was shared both in English and Hindi. The class presentation aimed at showcasing how education is done with different hands-on activities where learning is all about fun and engaging.

August buzzed with excitement as students engaged in a diverse array of activities that celebrated their patriotic spirit as Heritage Week was celebrated in the school. It commenced with a cooking without fire activity where students presented different tricolor dishes. Next students were divided into groups to perform a group dance on a folk song representing an Indian state. A Heritage collage competition was organised that encouraged students to explore their country's history and achievements, fostering admiration for their cultural roots. The Tricolor badge-making session highlighted the nation's diversity, enabling students to showcase their artistic talents while celebrating India's unique heritage.

Competitions motivate students to work harder and more deeply, giving them exposure to learn and expand their horizon. Keeping these thoughts in mind, our student Dakshith Dudeja, 1A participated in an Inter-school advertisement making competition hosted by Gems International School showcasing how they break environmental stereotypes and promote sustainable actions with their recyclable products.

English and Hindi Handwriting competitions were conducted for first-grade students encouraging them to improve their handwriting as well as their presentation skills.

The value of the month was Pride where discussions on the meaning and value of pride were discussed with the students. The feeling of pride for our nation was showcased by the students through badge-making activity and classroom discussions.

India celebrated its maiden National Space Day on August 23rd 2024 with the theme "Touching Lives while Touching the Moon: India's Space Saga. To commemorate this day students watched a presentation on Chandrayan and excitedly made their own Chandrayan.

The students celebrated Raksha Bandhan with great enthusiasm by creating colorful rakhis and exchanging them with their friends, following all the traditional rituals. They also took the initiative to make special rakhis for our Indian soldiers, honoring their bravery and dedication. This activity not only allowed the kids to express their creativity but also instilled a sense of patriotism and respect for those who protect our nation.

Imperial Heritage School hosted its 4th Annual Inter School Competition, MAADHYAM, on 24th August 2024 where students from over 25 schools across Gurugram participated. The theme was ***Linguistic Bridges to a Sustainable Future***, with all events dedicated to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.
