They engaged in hands-on activities that brought the subject to life, with the rocket landing simulation being a particular favorite. The event provided an enjoyable and educational experience, sparking excitement about space science among the students.

Our Grade III C students presented an energetic assembly to mark **National Sports Day**. They shared interesting facts about the day and performed a skit highlighting the importance of outdoor games in our lives. The skit showcased values like teamwork, discipline, and perseverance, inspiring us all. While studying multiplication in **Mathematics**, students participated in an array of activities to visualize and understand the concept.Our young mathematicians embarked on a colorful adventure to master division! 

3. General Information
