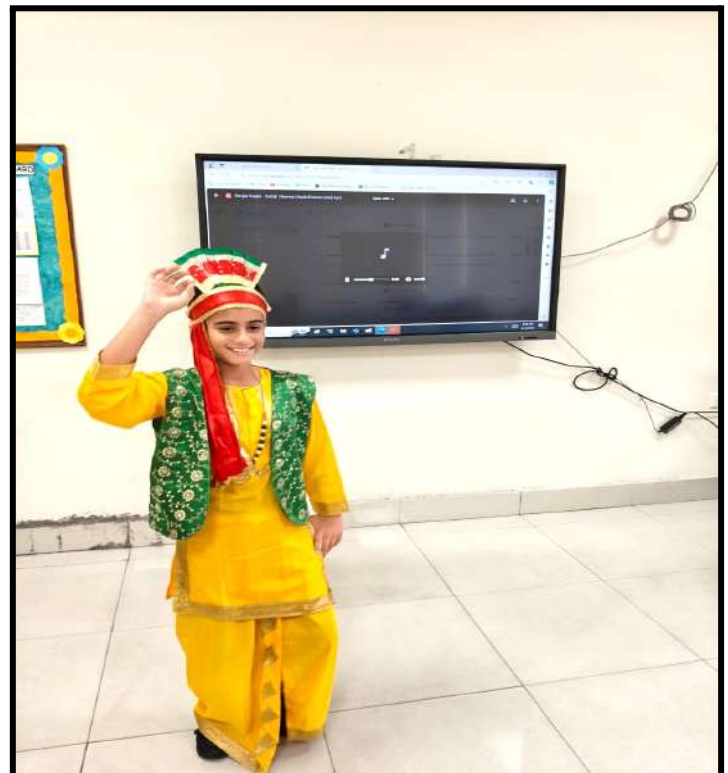

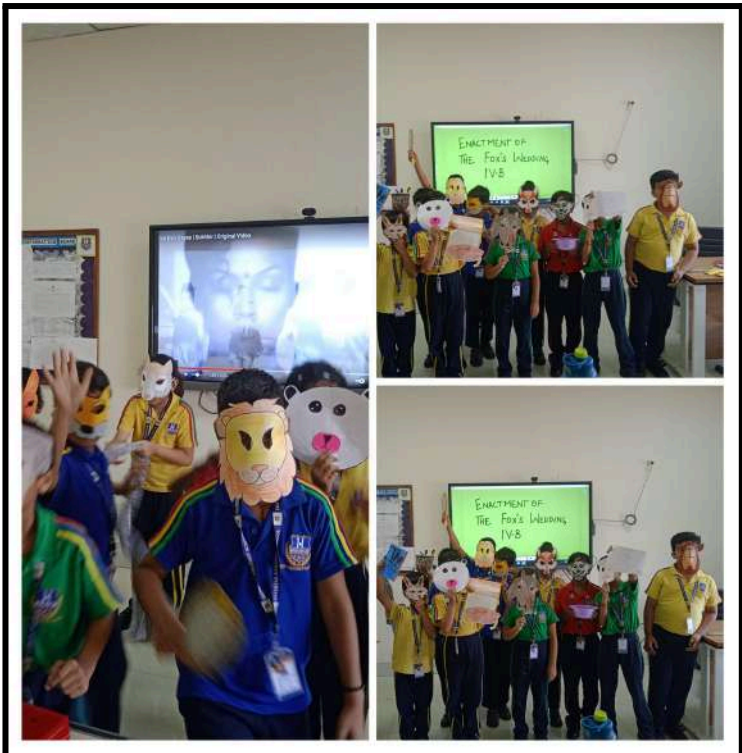
3. Eleutheria ,Gurugram Global Heights School Sector 102 on 5th August Event – Count like an Egyptian Participants: Vamika Shankla

Our students demonstrated their skills, creativity, and sportsmanship across these events, making us proud of their efforts and accomplishments.

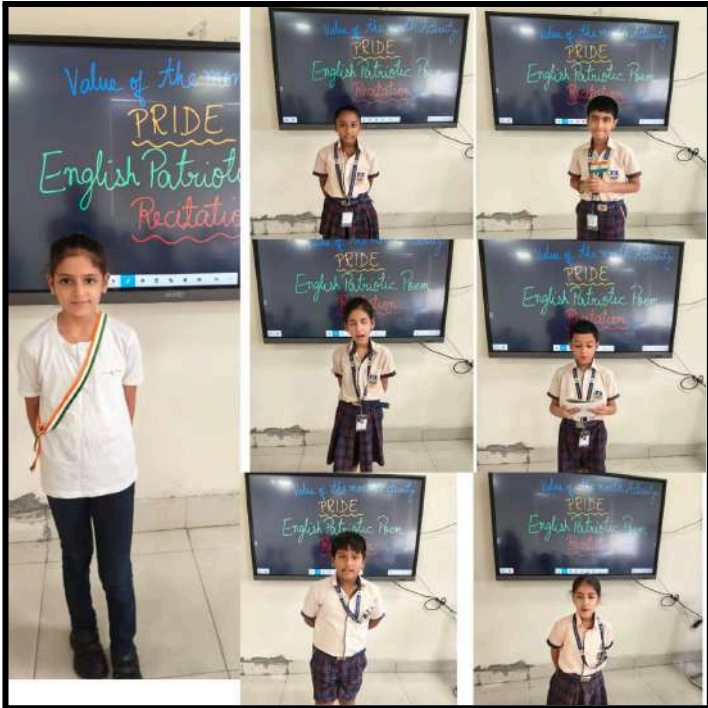
