The Government of India has declared August 23 of every year as '**National Space Day**' to commemorate the success of the Chandrayaan-3 mission, which accomplished the safe and soft landing of Vikram lander at 'Shiv Shakti' point and the deployment of Pragyaan Rover on the lunar surface on 23rd August, 2023. The proposed theme for the National Space Day 2024 is 'Touching Lives While Touching the Moon: India's Space Saga. An activity to brief the students about the Chandrayaan Mission in Grade IX was conducted. A demo for the **Space Explorers Workshop** was also conducted by Space Technology and Education Pvt Ltd. The IHS team eagerly anticipates wholehearted participation in the upcoming sessions.

The Annual Inter-School Event, **Maadhyam: Linguistic Bridges to a Sustainable Future**, took place with great enthusiasm on our school campus in August. Centered around the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, the event featured a range of competitions from participating schools across Gurugram.
