Hiroshima Day is observed every year on August 6 to commemorate the atomic bombing on Hiroshima city during World War II. The bombing serves as a reminder of the devastating impact of nuclear warfare and call for global peace and disarmament. The students of Grade IX made poster on the impact of Hiroshima attack.

Har Ghar Tiranga campaign is an initiative launched in 2022 by the Indian government's Ministry of Culture and MyGov as part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. The campaign's goal is to strengthen national unity and pride by encouraging every household to hoist the Indian flag, or Tiranga, in their homes. Students of Grade IX also participated in the activity and hoisted the Tiranga at their homes.

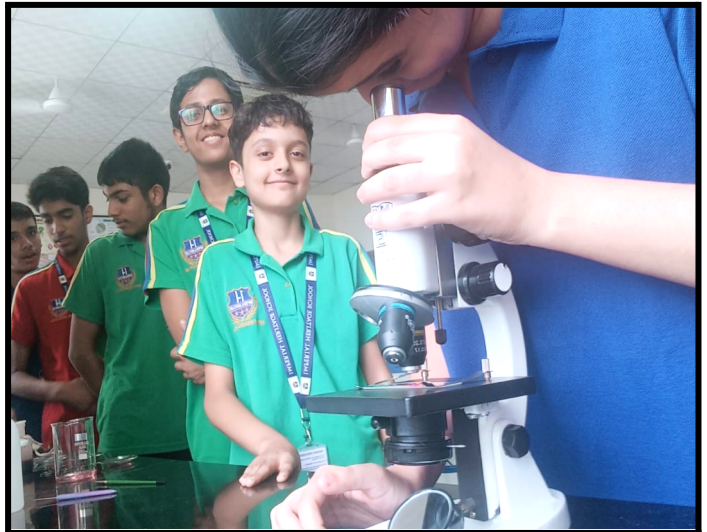
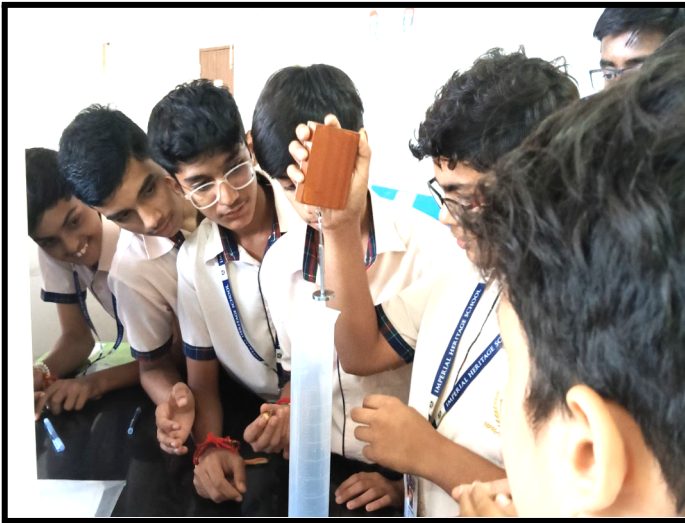
Vaidurya Tripathi of grade IX participated in “ Shruti Natak” Competition held in Manav Rachna International School.

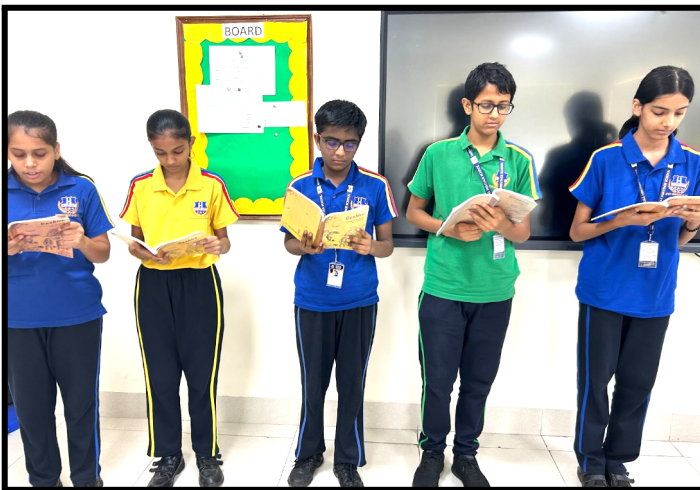
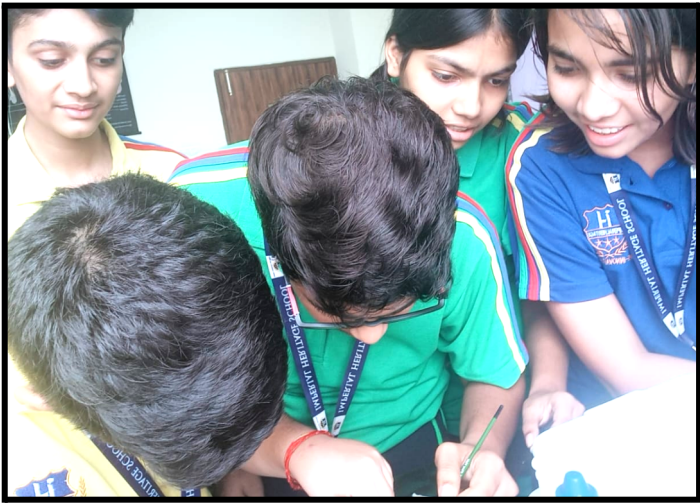
Under the CBSE reading challenge activity Students participated in the reading challenge.
