Dear Parents.

September is a significant month in India, marking the transition from the monsoon season to autumn. This period is vital for agriculture, as farmers prepare to harvest Kharif crops and begin sowing Rabi crops. Culturally, the month is vibrant with major festivals like Ganesh Chaturthi and Onam, fostering community bonds and celebrating traditions.

The month of August was filled with excitement, learning, patriotism, and celebrations, as our students jumped into various engaging activities. The month also played host to events like Theme Assembly, Heritage Week, and Maadhyam, our annual inter-school event.

In Literacy, the students focused on learning new letters and their corresponding sounds. In **EVS**, the focus was on the theme of **Food**. The students learned about the importance of food in keeping our bodies healthy and strong. Through various hands-on activities, they explored the differences between healthy and junk food and sorted food items into categories. They also discussed the nutritional benefits of fruits, vegetables, and whole grains, and understood why foods high in sugar and fat should be consumed in moderation.

The Theme Assembly provided a platform for students to express their thoughts and ideas around the chosen theme- Plants. During the assembly, they participated in various activities like skits, songs, and speeches that highlighted important information about plants and laid special emphasis on the germination process. It was an opportunity for them to build confidence, improve public speaking skills, and foster a sense of community and teamwork.

Friendship Day is a special occasion for children to celebrate the bonds of friendship. Our students made beautiful friendship bands as a symbol of their affection and camaraderie. Through this craft activity, the children not only showcased their creativity but also learned the value of friendship, sharing, and kindness. They exchanged these bands with their friends, strengthening their connections and creating a joyful atmosphere in the classroom.

In celebration of our national pride, the students participated in a Tri Colour Flower Craft activity. Using the colours of the Indian flag—saffron, white, and green—the children crafted beautiful paper flowers. This activity was not only fun, but also educational, as it taught them about the significance of the tricolour and what each colour represents.

Heritage Week was an exciting time where students explored and celebrated India's rich cultural heritage. Throughout the week, various activities were conducted to deepen their understanding of the country's traditions, history, and national pride.
